WHEREAS, the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is authorized by the ***Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)*** and related US Department of Transportation regulations to prepare, endorse; and periodically amend a short range Transportation Improvement Program for the 10-town MPO area within the Bridgeport-Stamford Urbanized Area;

WHEREAS, the MPO endorsed the ***FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Planning Regions (TIP)*** at its May 30th, 2024 meeting; and the US Department of Transportation (Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration) have approved the ***State FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)***;

WHEREAS, the ***BIL*** allocates funds to the State of Connecticut under various federal transportation assistance programs administered by the Federal Highway Administration;

WHEREAS, the ***BIL*** planning guidelines require the ***TIP/STIP*** to be fiscally constrained to available program funds;

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting amendments to the ***TIP/STIP*** to add program funding to continue on-going projects listed in the current ***TIP/STIP***;

WHEREAS, these amendments represent minor modifications of the ***TIP/STIP*** and involve projects that are exempt from the regional emissions analyses and do not necessitate a new air quality analysis;

WHEREAS, the public notification and review of these proposed amendments was consistent with and followed the procedures set forth in the MPO's ***Public Participation Plan***, as amended, and the proposed amendments are consistent with the goals and objectives of the Metropolitan Transportation Plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Planning Region.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greater Bridgeport and Valley MPO endorses the amendment of the ***FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program*** to include the projects as described and listed in the attachment to this resolution.

This resolution shall become effective as of January 29, 2026.

**AMENDMENT
FFY 2025-2028 STATE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM
(TIP/STIP): FHWA PROGRAMS**

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting the following amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP/TIP).

Below are summaries of each project. The proposed action(s), funding sources, air quality code, phase, year and cost allocation for each project are detailed in the attached report.

0015-0389: Repair and Upgrade Fixed Loading Ramp/Water Street Dock, Bridgeport: This project will repair and upgrade the existing fixed loading ramp at the Water Street Dock. The project will install a turbidity curtain, a steel pile wall and new fender piles, repair/replace timber piles and horizontal bracing and cross bracing, repair the deck areas and install the waterproof membrane and new asphalt and pavement markings.

Project 0015-0355 was previously initiated in 2015 through a Ferry Boat Discretionary award but was cancelled due to issues regarding the original scope versus funding availability. Through coordination between Bridgeport, CTDOT, and FHWA, a revised scope has now been developed that is acceptable to FHWA (approval of the revised scope is documented in a 1/12/23 email from Erik Shortell). This new project is being initiated to advance the revised scope.

0036-0207: Bridge Improvements; CT-8 Bridge 00572 over Housatonic Railroad, Derby: This is a three-span steel multi-beam superstructure on reinforced concrete abutments and is in overall Fair condition. The purpose of this project is to prevent the bridge from entering Poor condition. Specific improvements will be identified through the Rehabilitation Study Report.

0173-0560: Replace Traffic Control Signals at Various Locations, District 3: This project will fund full replacement, partial upgrade, or removal of traffic control signals to meet current standards. Specific locations in the region include:

Full replacement:

- 050-234: Fairfield - Route 135 at Walls Dr and I-95 On-ramp (non-CTSS)
- 126-218: Shelton - Route 110 at SR 712 (CTSS)
- 126-224: Shelton - SR 714 at ABS/Shelton Square North Drive (CTSS)
- 126-232: Shelton - Route 110 at Constitution Blvd. (CTSS)

Removal: 015-332: Bridgeport - Route 130 (State St) at Courtland Street

Linking Performance to Investment: States and MPOs are required to establish performance targets and utilize a performance-based approach to transportation decision-making¹. The



projects above are anticipated to support achievement of targets for the performance measures, as detailed in the attached report.

MPO Action: The proposed amendments are consistent with the long-range transportation plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization and conform to the air quality objectives. The proposed schedule, programming and funding adjustments will maintain a financially constrained TIP/STIP. 
