# AMENDMENT FFY 2025-2028 STATE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP/STIP): FHWA PROGRAMS

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting the following amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP/TIP).

Below are summaries of each project. The proposed action(s), funding sources, air quality code, phase, year and cost allocation for each project are detailed in the attached report.

<u>**0015-BUILDFY25:**</u> Congress Street Bridge Replacement, Bridgeport:</u> The City of Bridgeport's Congress Street Bridge project will replace a bridge span that has been out of service for 25 years. The proposed bridge spans the Pequonnock River and links the East Side with Downtown Bridgeport. The bridge will significantly reduce the automobile congestion which has proliferated at the East Washington and Stratford Avenue crossings and will feature the first dedicated bicycle lane on any Pequonnock River crossing, which will connect to the core of the City's existing bicycle network.

<u>0050-0228: SRTS Sidewalk Project; Mckinley Elementary School, Fairfield:</u> This project will construct approximately 7,300 feet of concrete sidewalk along various local streets in the vicinity of McKinley Elementary School. This project was originally prioritized as #4 for Transportation Alternatives funding at the May 30, 2024 meeting of the GBVMPO but did not fit into the financial constraints of the program. Subsequently, CTDOT selected the project for funding under the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) in 2025.

The project will enhance safe pedestrian mobility by closing gaps in the existing sidewalk, including construction of sidewalk ramps, curbing, drainage inlet adjustment, signage and pavement markings.

<u>0138-0253</u>: Replace Noise Barrier Between Exits 32 and 33 on I-95, Stratford: This project will replace approximately 1,815 feet of noise barrier on I-95 Northbound between Exits 32 and 33, along with the guiderail in front of the wall. The condition of the noise barrier has deteriorated to the point where it can no longer be maintained or repaired and the existing wall is timber, which is no longer considered a "best practice" material for sound abatement. The replacement wall will be made of a new material which will be determined during the design phase, with input from CTDOT Subject Matter Experts.

Federal funding for the design phase of this project was approved at the September 26, 2024 meeting of the GBVMPO.

<u>Linking Performance to Investment:</u> States and MPOs are required to establish performance targets and utilize a performance-based approach to transportation decision-making<sup>1</sup>. The projects above are anticipated to support achievement of targets for the performance measures, as detailed in the attached report.

**MPO Action:** The proposed amendments are consistent with the long-range transportation plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization and conform to the air quality objectives. The proposed schedule, programming and funding adjustments will maintain a financially constrained TIP/STIP. It is recommended that the MPO endorse the proposed amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 TIP/STIP as described above and listed in the attached tables.

# AMENDMENT FFY 2025-2028 STATE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP/STIP): FTA PROGRAMS

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting the following amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP/TIP).

Below are summaries of each project. The proposed action(s), funding sources, air quality code, phase, year and cost allocation for each project are detailed in the attached report.

<u>0300-2026TK, New Haven Line Track Program:</u> This project was adopted in May of 2024 as part of the initial 2025-2028 TIP; revisions to the project were approved by the GBVMPO in September 2024. The current TIP amendment will include \$8,000,000 federal of 5307 carryover funding to support the New Haven Line's Track Program (and \$2 million state). Activities include the continued purchase and installation of ties, turnouts, continuous welded rail, as well as surfacing track miles. Work is based on the annual cycle in order to maintain operating speeds and comfort.

<u>0304-0026CN: Waterbury Branch Line - Ansonia Railroad Station:</u> This is a new project which will provide 5307 carryover funding for improvements to the Ansonia rail station. The project includes installation of a new 350-foot-long platform with a heated fiber-reinforced polymer (FRP) deck, full canopy, and windscreens. The platform will be fully ADA compliant and meet the current MNR/CTDOT Office of Rail requirements for lighting, security, and passenger amenities. This project also includes 1700 feet of track realignment to reduce the gap between the platform and the train, which will require relocating a signal hut and elements of a grade crossing as well as relaying fiber and signal cables. The project will also improve parking and pedestrian access in the immediate platform vicinity, improve lighting, and add electric vehicle chargers.

<u>0304-0027CN: Waterbury Branch Line - Seymour Railroad Station:</u> This is a new project which will provide 5307 carryover funding for improvements to the Seymour rail station. The project includes installation of a new 350-foot-long platform with a heated fiber-reinforced polymer (FRP) deck, full canopy, and windscreens. The platform will be fully ADA compliant and meet the current MNR/CTDOT Office of Rail requirements for lighting, security, and passenger amenities. The project will replace and reconfigure the parking lots at the platform to improve safety for both pedestrians and vehicles, including lighting improvements and the addition of electric vehicle chargers. The project will also include pedestrian safety and traffic improvements along Main Street in the immediate station vicinity.

The following 2 projects are not in the GBVMPO Region. Since they are on the Waterbury Branch Line which runs through the GBVMPO Region (and Central Naugatuck Valley MPO), any improvements that occur on the WBL will have a benefit to the entire system (such as

time savings, efficiency, or safety). Thus, CTDOT has requested that these projects be included on the GBVMPO agenda to ensure that the GBVMPO is aware of projects that occur on the WBL.

<u>o304-0028CN: Waterbury Branch Line - Beacon Falls Railroad Station:</u> This is a new project which will provide 5307 carryover funding for improvements to the Beacon Falls rail station. The project includes installation of a new 350-foot-long platform with a heated fiber-reinforced polymer (FRP) deck, full canopy, and windscreens. The platform will be fully ADA compliant and meet the current MNR/CTDOT Office of Rail requirements for lighting, security, and passenger amenities. The project will include 1700 feet of track realignment to reduce the gap between the platform between the platform and the train, which will require relocating signal cables. The project will replace and reconfigure the parking lot at the platform to correct encroachment off the railroad property and will include lighting improvements and the addition of electric vehicle chargers.

<u>0304-0030CN: Waterbury Branch Line - Waterbury Railroad Station Improvements:</u> This project was approved by the GBVMPO in September 2024. The current TIP amendment will provide an additional \$4,000,000 of federal 5307 carryover funding for the Waterbury rail station improvements for a total project of cost of \$23.125 million (breakdown attached). The additional funds will be used to construct a new 350 foot high-level heated fiber-reinforced polymer (FRP) platform at the existing Waterbury Station. The platform will have full length canopies and windscreens, will be fully ADA compliant and will meet current requirements for lighting, security, and passenger amenities. In addition to significantly upgrading the existing station, the new platforms will enable faster boarding, enhanced safety and will be fully accessible for all commuters.

The projects above are anticipated to support achievement of targets for the performance measures, as detailed in the attached report.

The proposed schedule, programming and funding adjustments will maintain a financially constrained TIP/STIP.
