RESOLUTION 2025-01 AMENDMENT FFY 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FHWA PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is authorized by the *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)* and related US Department of Transportation regulations to prepare, endorse; and periodically amend a short range Transportation Improvement Program for the 10-town MPO area within the Bridgeport-Stamford Urbanized Area;

WHEREAS, the MPO endorsed the *FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for* the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Planning Regions (TIP) at its May 30th, 2024 meeting; and the US Department of Transportation (Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration) have approved the State FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (STIP);

WHEREAS, the *BIL* allocates funds to the State of Connecticut under various federal transportation assistance programs administered by the Federal Highway Administration;

WHEREAS, the *BIL* planning guidelines require the *TIP/STIP* to be fiscally constrained to available program funds;

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting amendments to the *TIP/STIP* to add program funding to continue on-going projects listed in the current *TIP/STIP*;

WHEREAS, these amendments represent minor modifications of the *TIP/STIP* and involve projects that are exempt from the regional emissions analyses and do not necessitate a new air quality analysis;

WHEREAS, the public notification and review of these proposed amendments was consistent with and followed the procedures set forth in the MPO's *Public Participation Plan*, as amended, and the proposed amendments are consistent with the goals and objectives of the Metropolitan Transportation Plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Planning Region.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greater Bridgeport and Valley MPO endorses the amendment of the *FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program* to include the projects as described and listed in the attachment to this resolution.

This resolution shall become effective as of November 21, 2024.

AMENDMENT FFY 2025-2028 STATE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP/STIP): FHWA PROGRAMS

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting the following amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP/TIP).

Below are summaries of each project. The proposed action(s), funding sources, air quality code, phase, year and cost allocation for each project are detailed in the attached report.

<u>0002-0130</u>, Ansonia, Drainage & Outlet Improvements at CT-334: The proposed amendment will remove 2025 federal construction funding for the project from the 2025-28 TIP. CTDOT's details note that all work will be completed under a future emergency declaration project. Federal 2024 ROW and FYI CON funding were approved for removal at the January 25, 2024 meeting of the GBVMPO.

This project was originally approved by the GBVMPO at the September 29th, 2022 meeting (21-24 TIP) and on May 30, 2024 as a project in the 2025-28 TIP. The purpose of the project is to provide drainage outlet upgrades on Route 334 and includes reconstruction and stabilization of currently eroded side slopes.

<u>0124-0173, CT-8 Pavement Rehab (Seymour-Naugatuck):</u> This project will rehabilitate the existing wearing surface of the pavement structure for both directions on CT-8 in Seymour, Beacon Falls and Naugatuck. The pavement has reached the age that requires a structural rehabilitation to maintain a state of good repair and consistency with FHWA pavement guidelines. The project includes replacement of substandard roadside safety features, various bridge work, median work, shoulder reconstruction, cleaning of all pipes and culverts, and upgrading vehicle detection as needed. The project abuts project 0036-0203 at MP 19.35 (Seymour) and will run to MP 25.27 in Naugatuck, including ramps.

<u>0138-0255, Stratford, Housatonic River Greenway, Phase 3:</u> The Housatonic River Greenway Plan was completed in 2008 and the first two phases of the greenway have been completed. This project will implement the 3rd phase of the trail, which will run along Ferry Boulevard/CT-130. The section will begin at Elm Street and run north and east to the Dock Shopping Center and Devon Bridge (Milford line).

This project was part of the 2019 Transportation Alternatives competitive solicitation process (for fiscal years 2021-25). It was originally ranked as the 9th priority at the August 29th, 2019 meeting of the GBVMPO. Subsequent to 2019, additional funding became available in 2022 and the project became the 6th priority: 2 of the 3 original highest priority projects had been completed and one of the projects was removed. In 2024 some of the higher ranked projects were removed and the Stratford project now fits into the fiscal constraints of the program.

<u>0170-3743, Detection Upgrades at Various Traffic Signals, Bridgeport-Stamford UZA:</u> This project was originally approved by the GBVMPO on May 30, 2024 as part of the 2021-24 TIP. This amendment will add the project to the 2025-28 TIP. The project will utilize Carbon Reduction Program funds to upgrade traffic signal detection capabilities, which will reduce vehicle delays and emissions. The project will replace in-pavement loop detectors with 360-degree stop bar detection cameras and dilemma zone detection radar units at 76 state-owned signals. Locations in the GBVMPO region are listed on the next two pages (from the original May 2024 amendment).

<u>O170-CFI22-23, Install EV Chargers at Various Locations:</u> This project will implement USDOT's Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) award to CTDEEP. The project will build alternative fuel infrastructure across Connecticut to increase access to both electric vehicle supply equipment/infrastructure (EVSE) and hydrogen fueling infrastructure for medium- and heavyduty (MHD) vehicles

In the region the project will install 12 direct current fast charging stations (DCFCs) at 2 locations in Bridgeport: Brewport Brewing Company and Boca Oyster Bar/Steelpointe Harbor, a total of 24 DCFCs. Locations were determined for their impact: by the number of EVs they would serve and for impacts on surrounding communities, which include environmental justice and overburdened communities.

<u>NHCOG</u>: This project will assess and determine the vulnerability and risks to transportation infrastructure and services from current and future major natural events by developing a Resilience Improvement Plan for the northern, non-coastal portion of Connecticut. The project is a collaboration between NVCOG, CRCOG, NECCOG, and NHCOG, and covers 94 cities and towns, including several of the state's largest cities, as well as the 4 Valley municipalities of Ansonia, Derby, Seymour, and Shelton.

The plan will complete a risk-based evaluation of impacts of extreme weather events (particularly extreme precipitation events) and examine how climate stressors (such as increases in annual precipitation and severity of events) may directly or indirectly affect local/municipal transportation assets through a horizon date of 2050. The project will be coordinated with and complement the concurrent Resilience Improvement Plan being completed by CTDOT.

O170-WCPP22-23, Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program Grant (statewide): Understanding how roads affect wildlife in Connecticut and reducing Wildlife-vehicle collisions (WVCs) has been and continues to be a priority for state agencies. The goals of this project are to reduce WVCs and improve habitat connectivity. This project will conduct a spatial analysis that identifies critical habitat blocks, wildlife corridors, and priority road-segments where wildlife are most vulnerable to collisions or in need of movement between habitats. The results of the spatial analysis will be included in a mapping toolset that will be housed within CTDOT's existing Open Data platform and be available for public and practitioner use. Results will be utilized by CTDOT as a consideration for future infrastructure projects and CTDOT will work closely with CTDEEP's Wildlife Division to identify and analyze opportunities to enhance wildlife crossings and reduce

WVCs and will use this initial mapping as a base to incorporate additional data sources as they become available.

Currently there is limited systematic data collection for WVCs in the state. Data associated with deer and other animal collisions that result in injury or property damage and generate a police report are included in the CT Crash Data Repository. According to the repository, there have been 8,359 recorded deer-vehicle incidents resulting in injury or property damage since January 2015. Of these incidents, over 500 resulted in injuries, including 3 fatalities.

The project is based on the recommendations presented in the FHWA's Report to Congress Wildlife—vehicle Collision Reduction Study: Best Practices Manual, which emphasizes that large scale statewide or regional planning is the best foundation to substantially reduce WVCs. The project originated from collaboration between state agencies (CTDOT and CTDEEP) and The Nature Conservancy's (TNC) Connecticut Chapter. As recommended by the report WVC data and habitat linkage zones will be incorporated into the analysis as this provides better insight into animal movements.

<u>Linking Performance to Investment:</u> States and MPOs are required to establish performance targets and utilize a performance-based approach to transportation decision-making¹. The projects above are anticipated to support achievement of targets for the performance measures, as detailed in the attached report.

MPO Action: The proposed amendments are consistent with the long range transportation plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization and conform to the air quality objectives. The proposed schedule, programming and funding adjustments will maintain a financially constrained TIP/STIP. It is recommended that the MPO endorse the proposed amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 TIP/STIP as described above and listed in the attached tables.

WHEREAS, these amendments represent minor modifications of the *TIP/STIP* and involve projects that are exempt from the regional emissions analyses and do not necessitate a new air quality analysis;

WHEREAS, the public notification and review of these proposed amendments was consistent with and followed the procedures set forth in the MPO's *Public Participation Plan*, as amended, and the proposed amendments are consistent with the goals and objectives of the Metropolitan Transportation Plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Planning Region.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greater Bridgeport and Valley MPO endorses the amendment of the *FFY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program* to include the projects as described and listed in the attachment to this resolution.

AMENDMENT FFY 2025-2028 STATE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP/STIP): FTA PROGRAMS

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is requesting the following amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP/TIP).

Below are summaries of each project. The proposed action(s), funding sources, air quality code, phase, year and cost allocation for each project are detailed in the attached report.

<u>0036-2024EQ, VTD Admin Capital/Misc Support for FY24</u>: This project was approved by GBVMPO as part of the original 2021-24 TIP in October of 2020. The purpose of this amendment is to move the project from the 2021-24 TIP as 5307C-funded to the current 2025-28 TIP as 5307P-carryover funded. This will allow for the NVCOG/VTD to apply for these funds in the current fiscal year (2025).

<u>0036-2024PA, VTD Replace 14 (2018) Small Buses FY 2024:</u> This project will provide the NVCOG/VTD with FY 2024 5307P carryover funds to fund a new project in the 2025-28 TIP. Funds will be used to replace 14 vehicles that have reached the end of their useful life.

<u>Linking Performance to Investment:</u> States and MPOs are required to establish performance targets and utilize a performance-based approach to transportation decision-making¹. The projects above are anticipated to support achievement of targets for the performance measures, as detailed in the attached report.

MPO Action: The proposed amendments are consistent with the long range transportation plans of the Greater Bridgeport and Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization and conform to the air quality objectives. The proposed schedule, programming and funding adjustments will maintain a financially constrained TIP/STIP. It is recommended that the MPO endorse the proposed amendments to the FFY 2025-2028 TIP/STIP as described above and listed in the attached tables.
