- 2. <u>Project 0410-xxx, Replace Radio System, GBT:</u> This project will replace GBT's radio system with one that follows the State's CTTransit Model. The benefits of this complex project will include greatly enhanced coverage and reliability, interoperability with partner transit agencies and first responders, enhanced system resiliency and limited network maintenance. Components of this replacement include:
  - Transition voice communications to the CT DESPP network.
  - Transition TransitMaster data communications to a cellular network.
  - Replace all existing radio subscribers, such as dispatch consoles and mobiles.
  - Install cellular routers in GBT buses.
  - Installation a dedicated data line to the nearest CT DESPP outlet.
  - Configuration of requisite equipment.

GBT's existing private voice and data radio network is a critical piece of operations and is a single point of failure, both for voice and data communications. The systems in place are greater than 15 years in age and are becoming increasingly difficult and costly to maintain, resulting in diminished reliability. Further, this system has suffered from a limited coverage area, due to limitations placed on the system by the FCC.

Project 0410-xxx, Facility Improvements - Fire Suppression for BEB's (Battery Electric Buses), GBT: This project was developed as a part of GBT's Zero Emission Bus program and is aimed at providing supplemental fire suppression for the battery electric propulsion systems at GBT's Cross Street garage. The project includes: Interior Sprinkler Heads and Piping, Fire Pump House and Fire Pump, Heat Detectors, Smoke and Heat Exhaust System, and Contingency.
