NOTICE OF INTENT TO PARTICPATE EPA CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT PROGRAM

Bridgeport, Connecticut

I certify that the following is a true copy of the vote of the Connecticut Metropolitan Council of Governments on March 30, 2023, Bridgeport, Connecticut, a quorum being present:

WHEREAS, through the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 (IRA), Congress have provided many tools to pursue greenhouse gas (GHG) pollution reductions, including the Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG) Program, which is to be implemented by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA); and

WHEREAS, the CPRG Program will support the development and expansion of state, territory, tribal, and local climate action plans and the expeditious implementation of policies, programs, and projects to reduce GHG pollution in the near term; and

WHEREAS, EPA is seeking to reduce GHGs and associated criteria and toxic air pollution through the deployment of new technologies, operational efficiencies, and solutions that will transition America to a low-carbon economy; and

WHEREAS, Section 60114 of the Inflation Reduction Act appropriates planning and implementation funding to the EPA to support efforts by states, municipalities, air pollution control agencies and other eligible entities to develop and implement plans to reduce GHGs;

WHEREAS, EPA will award \$1 million in formula funding for planning grants (cooperative agreements) to each of the 67 most populous metropolitan areas; and

WHEREAS, EPA's formula funding prioritizes the development of a Priority Climate Action Plan, a Comprehensive Climate Action plan and a Status Report for the most populous metropolitan areas nationally (as defined by U.S. Census 2020 MSA population); and

WHEREAS, as the 59th largest metropolitan area in the United States, the Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk, CT Metro Area, with a 2020 population of 957,419, is eligible for \$1 million in formula planning funds; and

WHEREAS, the climate plan for a metropolitan area should address GHG emissions and reduction measures throughout the entire metropolitan area; and



WHEREAS, EPA recommends that the leaders of municipalities and local governments (such as leaders of cities, counties, and local air pollution control agencies) within and around a metropolitan area coordinate with each other to identify an eligible lead organization to administer the formula planning grant; and

WHEREAS, MetroCOG and the Western Connecticut Council of Governments (WestCOG) will coordinate on the development of Climate Action Plan for the Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk MSA; and

WHEREAS, to accept these funds, the lead organization for a metropolitan area must submit a Notice of Intent to Participate (NOIP) to EPA by April 28, 2023 which will include documentation from collaborating jurisdictions indicating their commitment to work with the lead organization on the metropolitan area plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CONNECTICUT METROPOLITAN COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- That the MetroCOG Board of Directors authorizes the Executive Director to submit a Notice of Intent to Participate (NOIP) and Complete Application to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program for the Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk Metropolitan Statistical Area.
- The MetroCOG Board of Directors Authorizes the Agency's Executive Director, Matthew Fulda, or his designee, to act on behalf of MetroCOG in negotiating and executing all appropriate and necessary contractual instruments as may be necessary for the purpose of supporting the CPRG Program.
